### GENERAL EXHIBIT RULES

1. Read Open Class and General Exhibit Rules carefully.
2. Exhibitors shall be from Rice and surrounding counties.

#### ENTRY & RELEASE DAYS & TIMES!

3. All exhibits must be entered between 9 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Monday, July 13.

Release of exhibits – must be picked up between  
6:00 – 7:00 p.m. pm Sunday, July 19  
11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on Monday, July 20.

4. All exhibits must be owned/made by the exhibitor. Must have been completed within the past two years and can be exhibited only once at the Rice County Fair.
5. **To make exhibit tags accurate, bring address labels if you have them.**
6. Articles exhibited as a collection cannot be exhibited separately.
7. No article will be assigned to a place until the entry is made.
8. Complaints should be filed with the Department Superintendent.
9. Failure to abide by any rules or regulations will be reason to withhold premiums.
10. **Premiums - Open Class General** - Any person in Rice County, and others as indicated, can exhibit in this department. Open Class General includes: clothing, foods, hobby craft, photography, fine arts, farm & garden crops, fruits, flowers and others.
11. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of prize by the judge regardless of the number in competition for a premium.
12. The management reserves the right to pro-rate prizes in the event that it is necessary.
13. Individual exhibitors who are exhibiting more than one exhibit in a lot can receive **only one premium.**
14. **All wall hangings and pictures must have permanent hangers.**
15. Junior Division - includes anyone 16 and under by entry day.
16. Elementary Division – includes anyone 10 and under by entry day.
17. Open Class building exhibitors will be judged on Tuesday, July 14 starting at 8 a.m., except food and food preservation, which will be judged on Monday, July 13 at 6:30 p.m.
18. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons may be given in each sub-heading under each class and one overall Grand Champion ribbon in each class. No extra premium will be paid. Adults and Juniors are separate sub-headings.
19. Honorable Mention ribbons can be given at the discretion of the judge.
20. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of a prize by the judge.
21. Premium checks will be available no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the fair.
22. No unauthorized gambling will be allowed on grounds.
23. **No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in buildings.**

24. Parking - each vehicle entering the fairgrounds must obtain and display one of the following permit: Daily \$5 OR Weekly \$15.

The management will not be responsible for loss of any exhibit or for any damage done to same, but will endeavor to take proper care of all exhibits.
