LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Read Livestock Rules and Health Requirements carefully.
2. Use entry form to enter all livestock. Entries must be made in advance to the superintendents of the respective departments by July 1st.
3. Open to residents of Minnesota and out-of-state as space permits.
4. All entries must be owned by the exhibitor, except in case of group prizes in livestock.
5. No entry will be assigned a space until the entry check-in is complete.
6. Complaints should be filed with the Livestock Committee.
7. Failure to abide by any rules or regulations will be reason to withhold premiums.
8. In case there is no competition in any class, prize money awarded will be left to the discretion of the judge.
9. Any person in Rice County, and others as indicated, can exhibit in this department. Open Class Livestock includes: beef, horse, goat and sheep.
10. Premium checks will be available no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the fair.
11. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of prize by the judge.
12. No more than two premiums per individual lot, or one premium in group lot, will be awarded to one exhibitor.
13. The management reserves the right to pro-rate prizes in the event that it is necessary.
14. No unauthorized gambling will be allowed on grounds.
15. **No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in barns.**
16. Parking - each vehicle entering the fairgrounds must obtain and display one of the following permit: Daily \$5 **OR** Weekly \$15.
17. **Animal registration papers or proof of being eligible for registration must be presented at the time of fair entry. If no registration papers are presented your entry will be eligible for grade only classes** (dairy excluded if applicable).
18. FFA and Rice County 4-H members are eligible to show in open class competition if entry fee is paid.
19. **All animals must have adequate bedding. NO bedding/feed will be provided by the Fairboard.**
20. All fans must meet electrical inspection. Fan position and safety can be regulated by the Livestock Committee and/or Fair Vet. No Butt Fans.
21. Wheel barrels for waste should be emptied frequently. Do not over fill. Do not leave in the aisles. Clean-up your spills. Keep the walkways inside and outside clean.
22. No livestock on the North side of the barns.

The management will not be responsible for loss of any exhibit or for any damage done to same, but will endeavor to take proper care of all exhibits.

NO PARKING BEHIND THE BARNES!

Livestock entries should enter the fairgrounds by the North Gate only!

Unload and load only on the south side of the barns. This means everything – animals, equipment, feed, hay, straw etc.

EXHIBITION RULES OF LIVESTOCK IN MINNESOTA

Livestock and poultry that exhibit symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts, may not be exhibited. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibition. All animals imported into Minnesota for exhibition must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection and satisfy Board of Animal Health importation requirements.

Cattle originating from Minnesota's MA zone:

Animal movement certificate - All cattle that are moved from the MA zone to exhibition must be accompanied by an animal movement certificate approved by the Board.

Whole herd test - All cattle originating from Minnesota's MA zone must originate from a herd that has had a whole-herd tuberculosis test within 12 months of exhibition.

Individual animal tests - With the exception of items (1) and (2), each animal for exhibition must be negative to an official tuberculosis test conducted within 60 days prior to being moved for exhibition purposes. 1) animals that originate directly from an tuberculosis accredited herd 2) animals less than two months of age

Cattle originating from Minnesota's MAA zone and being exhibited in the MA zone

Official identification - All cattle originating from the MAA zone which are being exhibited in the MA zone must be officially identified.

Permit - Exhibitors whose cattle have originated from the MAA zone must obtain a permit from the Board prior to exhibiting these animals in the MA zone.

Individual animal test - Call the Board office to determine if a tuberculosis test is required.

Cattle originating from Minnesota's MAA being exhibited in the MAA zone - No state requirements.

Note: Always check with exhibition management to make sure they have not imposed any restrictions or additional requirements on the exhibition of Minnesota cattle, particularly those which originate from the MA zone. For Minnesota State Fair tuberculosis testing requirements, call 651-288-4417 or visit www.mnstatefair.org.

Malignant Catarrhal Fever - Malignant Catarrhal Fever (MCF) is a disease caused by a Herpesvirus that is naturally carried by sheep. Natural carriers, or reservoir hosts, are

clinically unaffected by the virus, but can be a source of infection to susceptible animals, such as cattle. Clinical signs in cattle are variable, but may include: high fever, diarrhea, ocular and nasal discharge, seizures, and sudden death. Cattle are at greatest risk for developing MCF when they are at shows or fairs that put them in close proximity to sheep, young lambs in particular. To reduce the risk of MCF in cattle, keep them separated from sheep and lambs. This disease is not passed between cattle and does not affect humans. For More Information, Please go to:

Sheep - All sheep, including wethers, must be identified with official identification approved for use in the Scrapie eradication program.

Goats - All goats, including wethers, must be identified with official identification approved for use in the Scrapie eradication program.

Goats originating from Minnesota's MA zone

Animal movement certificate - All goats that are moved from the MA zone to exhibition must be accompanied by an animal movement certificate approved by the Board.

Whole herd test - All goats originating from Minnesota's MA zone must originate from a herd that has had a whole-herd tuberculosis test within 12 months of exhibition.

Individual animal tests - With the exception of items (1) and (2), each animal for exhibition must be negative to an official tuberculosis test conducted within 60 days prior to being moved for exhibition purposes. 1) animals that originate directly from an tuberculosis accredited herd 2) animals less than two months of age.

Goats originating from Minnesota's MAA zone and being exhibited in the MA zone

Permit - Exhibitors whose goats have originated from the MAA zone must obtain a permit from the Board prior to exhibiting these animals in the MA zone.

Individual animal test - Call the Board office to determine if a tuberculosis test is required.

Goats originating from Minnesota's MAA being exhibited in the MAA zone - No state requirements.

Note: Always check with exhibition management to make sure they have not imposed any restrictions or additional requirements on the exhibition of Minnesota goats, particularly those which originate from the MA zone. For Minnesota State Fair tuberculosis testing requirements, call 651-288-4417 or visit www.mnstatefair.org.

Horses - All horses must be negative to an official test for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within 12 months prior to the opening date of the exhibition. A test is not required for suckling foals accompanying a negative dam.

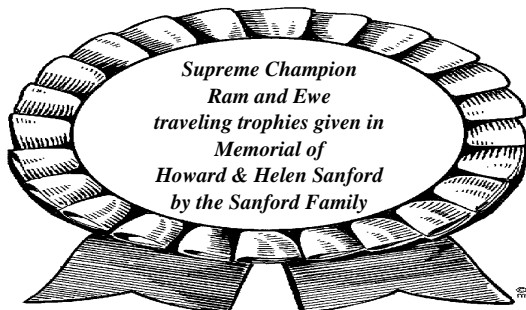

2. Official Scrapie Identification ear tag or tattoo must be in all goats.
3. Use the Goat Entry Form and send form and fee (check payable to Rice County Fair) to Glen Bauer, 6034 Kenyon Blvd, Faribault, MN 55021.

4. The Junior and Senior Shows are separately sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern.
5. Classes are sanctioned for: Alpine, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, Toggenburg and Recorded Grade.
6. The original registration certificate is required for all does six months of age or older, and must be shown to the show secretary before the show begins. A stamped duplicate will be accepted for does under six months of age. No copies will be accepted.
7. Health papers are required for all animals from out of state, six months of age or older. Only healthy animals may be shown.
8. To qualify for premiums, goats must be in place by 10 p.m. on Saturday. Released after the show but not before 6 p.m.
9. Veterinarian check by 8 a.m. on Sunday.
10. The barn will open on Saturday for penning. All goats must be in the barn by 10:00 p.m. on Saturday. Pen space may be limited.
11. There will be no pre-show milk out.

12. There are no limits to the number of entries, however, premiums are limited to two per class, per breed entered, except in group classes which will be one entry per exhibitor.
13. All animals must be shown in a regular class to qualify for groups.
14. Show order: Juniors – each breed
Seniors – each breed.

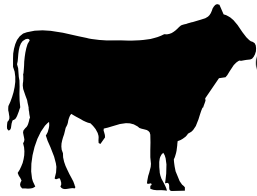
