GENERAL EXHIBIT RULES

1. Read Open Class and General Exhibit Rules carefully.
2. Exhibitors shall be from Rice and surrounding counties.
3. All exhibits must be owned/made by the exhibitor. Must have been completed within the past two years and can be exhibited only once at the Rice County Fair.
4. Articles exhibited as a collection cannot be exhibited separately.
5. No article will be assigned to a place until the entry is made.
6. Complaints should be filed with the Department Superintendent.
7. Failure to abide by any rules or regulations will be reason to withhold premiums.
8. **Premiums - Open Class General** - Any person can exhibit. Open Class General includes: clothing, foods, hobbies & crafts, photography, fine arts, farm & garden crops, fruits, flowers and others.
9. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of prize by the judge regardless of the number in competition for a premium.
10. The management reserves the right to pro-rate prizes in the event that it is necessary.
11. Individual exhibitors who are exhibiting more than one exhibit in a lot can receive **only one premium.**
12. **All wall hangings and pictures must have permanent hangers.**
13. Junior Class—includes exhibitor 16 & under by entry day.
14. Elementary Class—includes exhibitor 10 & under by entry day.
15. Open Class Food exhibits will be judged on Monday, July 18. **All exhibits in Classes 1, 2 & 3 must be entered by 5 p.m. on Monday to be judged at 6:30 p.m.**
16. Open Class building exhibitors will be judged on Tuesday, July 19 starting at 8 a.m. (see rule #15 for foods).
17. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons may be given in each sub-heading under each class and one overall Grand Champion ribbon in each class. No extra premium will be paid. Adults, Juniors & Elementary are separate sub-headings.
18. Honorable Mention ribbons can be given at the discretion of the judge.
19. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of a prize by the judge.
20. Premium checks will be available no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the fair.
21. No unauthorized gambling will be allowed on grounds.
22. **No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in buildings.**
23. Parking - each vehicle entering the fairgrounds must obtain and display one of the following permit: Daily \$5 **OR** Weekly \$20.

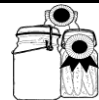

3. Items must have been preserved within the last 12 months.
4. Use preservation methods from the current University of Minnesota Extension publications which can be located at www.extension.umn.edu
5. All low acid products must be processed in pressure canner.
6. Fruits, tomatoes, pickles, jams and jellies must be processed by boiling water bath or pressure cooker.
7. Entries passing the appearance test may be opened and tested for final placing.
