## Public Notice to All Concerned

- While the greatest care will be executed by the Management to protect patrons of the Rice County Fair, each individual will be held responsible for his/her actions, and the Management will not be accountable or responsible for any injury.
- The Rice County Agricultural Society Management assumes no liability for loss or damage to any property of the concessionaire, exhibitors or patrons due to theft, fire, tornado, weather conditions or other causes.
- The Directors of the Rice County Fair Board reserve the right to refuse any offensive or obscene exhibits which in the judgment of the Fair Board would be offensive to the general public.
- No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the grounds or in any building, except in the Beer Garden.
- Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. The designated location is the North West corner of the fairgrounds, by Hwy 3 and Fairgrounds Drive. The space is 50' x 50' on fairgrounds property. No entrance or exits can be obstructed or limited in any way.

## LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Read Livestock Rules and Health Requirements carefully.
2. Use appropriate entry form to enter livestock. Entries must be made in advance to the superintendents of the respective departments by deadline.
3. **Entry form must list the animal required ear tag/tattoo and official Scrapie ID number. Failure to submit complete entry and payment will result in forfeiture of your premium check.**
4. Open to residents of Minnesota and out-of-state as space permits.
5. All entries must be owned by the exhibitor, except in case of group prizes in livestock.
6. No entry will be assigned a space until the entry check-in is complete.
7. Complaints should be filed with the Livestock Committee.
8. All animals entered must be shown in the ring to receive premium.
9. Failure to abide by any rules or regulations will be reason to withhold premiums.
10. In case there is no competition in any class, prize money awarded will be left to the discretion of the judge.
11. Any person in Rice County, and others as indicated, can exhibit in this department. Open Class Livestock includes: beef, horse, goat and sheep.
12. Premium checks will be available no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the fair.
13. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of prize by the judge.
14. No more than two premiums per individual lot, or one premium in group lot, will be awarded to one exhibitor.
15. Management reserves the right to pro-rate prizes if necessary.
16. No unauthorized gambling will be allowed on grounds.
17. **No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in barns.**
18. Parking - each vehicle entering the fairgrounds must obtain and display one of the following permit: daily \$7 (per visit) **OR** weekly \$20.
19. **Animal registration papers or proof of being eligible for registration must be presented at the time of fair entry. If no registration papers are presented your entry will be eligible for grade only classes.**
20. FFA and Rice County 4-H members are eligible to show in open class competition if entry fee is paid.
21. **All animals must have adequate bedding. NO bedding/feed will be provided by the Fairboard.**
22. All fans must meet electrical inspection. Fan position and safety can be regulated by the Livestock Committee and/or Fair Vet. No Butt Fans.
23. Wheel barrels for waste should be emptied frequently. Do not over fill. Do not leave in the aisles. Clean-up your spills. Keep the walkways

**inside and outside** clean.

24. No livestock on the North side of the barns.
25. Trailers, campers, trucks or other vehicles used for living purposes during the fair must be parked in designated camping areas only. Owner of the vehicle must secure a camping pass from the Fair Secretary's office prior to parking the vehicle.

**The management will not be responsible for loss of any exhibit or for any damage done to same, but will endeavor to take proper care of all exhibits.**

## NO PARKING BEHIND THE BARNES!

**Livestock entries should enter the fairgrounds  
by the North Gate only!  
Unload and load only on the south side of the barns.  
This means everything! – animals, equipment, feed, hay, straw**

## MN LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION RULES

### General Requirements:

Animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibition. All out-of-state animals must meet MN importation requirements. No animal may enter or be at an exhibition that is showing clinical signs of any infectious, contagious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts.

### Sheep and Goats

Sheep and goats must be officially identified. No sheep or goat that is within 30 days of giving birth (either before or after) may be exhibited without prior approval from the Board.

### Horses

Horses, except suckling foals accompanying a negative dam, must be negative to an official equine infectious anemia (Coggins) test conducted within 12 months prior to the opening date of an exhibition.

This show is held in cooperation with the American Dexter Cattle Association (ADCA), the Purebred Dexter Cattle Association (PDCA) and the Legacy Dexter Cattle Registry (Legacy).

**REQUIREMENTS:**

1. Read Livestock Rules carefully.
2. All owners of cattle exhibited must be current members of the ADCA, PDCA or Legacy.
3. Cattle must be registered in the ADCA, PDCA or Legacy at the time of the show, and papers will be checked in the usual manner. Calves under six months to be shown in the Cow/Calf class need not be registered, but if not registered, they are not eligible for age classes.
4. **Pre-registration DEADLINE is July 10<sup>th</sup>!** Send entries to Carmen Tripp, 6600 French Lake Trail, Faribault, MN 55021. Entry fee must accompany pre-registration, check made out to the Rice County Fair, non-refundable.
5. Health Regulations & Identification:
  - A. All cattle must be identified by ear tag, neck chain, brand, or legibly tattooed with the exact alphanumeric identification which appears on the registration papers.
  - B. Cattle from Minnesota: No certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) required.
  - C. Cattle from outside Minnesota:
    - a. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) is required. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) must list the Rice County Fair as consignee and an import permit number must be documented on the CFI.
    - b. CVI is valid for 30 days from the date the animals were inspected by an accredited veterinarian.
    - c. Must meet the Minnesota Importation requirements. See [bah.state.mn.us/imports](http://bah.state.mn.us/imports), or call the Minnesota Board of Animal Health at 651-296-2942.
    - d. Must meet the importation requirements of their state of origin if they are returning.
6. All animals must be in place by July 16, 3 p.m. for veterinarian check.
7. All cattle must be double-tied (neck rope plus halter and rope). Bulls 12 months and older are to be shown with an affixed nose ring or nose clamp also to be used whenever moving the bull around the premises.
8. All cattle, stalls and walkways must be kept clean and presentable at all times.
9. Cattle will be shown according to ADCA show guidelines. This show is considered a "Blow and Go" show with the following guidelines:
  - A. Prohibited Items: \* painting or polishing of horns or hooves with colored polish \* artificial coat coloring \* growth implants \* drugs to alter the disposition of the animal (Xylazine/Romun, Calf Calm Paste, etc.) \* adhesives or any compounds that have adhesive qualities that, when applied, cannot be combed or brushed through – these products and similar ones are prohibited: Prime Time, EZ Comb, Tail Adhesive, Ultra White Touch Up, Black Touch Up, Black Finisher, black show foam, etc.
  - B. Alcohol, water, oil or any product that is alcohol or water-based and have no adhesive or glue qualities are the types of grooming products that are permissible. These items include such products as: Kleen Sheen, Revive, Final Bloom, Show Sheen, and white show foam.
10. Show attire consists of collared/buttoned shirts (full button or polo/gulf) appropriate for the weather (no personal, farm, or association names other than official association logos); clean untorn dark colored jeans or slacks (no leggings); boots (not muck boots) or fully enclosed heavy footwear (no sandals or canvas shoes). Optional: belt, western hats (no baseball caps), gloves or the use of show sticks and combs.
11. All cattle must be halter broke to lead and must be manageable. Any animal deemed unmanageable by the show management before or during the show will be required to leave the show arena. Cattle dismissed in

this fashion are not eligible for show placing premiums, and all entry fees will be forfeited.

12. All cattle must be kept to the south end of the barns both unloading and loading. All cattle will enter the judging arena and barns from the south side. NO CATTLE ARE ALLOWED ON THE NORTH SIDE OF BARNs.

- 17. Premiums will be paid according to the sliding scale listed below, however, every sheep exhibited and placed in the ring will receive a minimum \$2.00 premium.
- 18. Registration papers must be presented at check-in for sheep to be shown.
- 19. Classes with 12 or more sheep entered will be split evenly into two classes. The MSSA will split the classes and post in the sheep barn by 10:00 p.m. on Friday. (This applies to both Senior and Junior Shows.)
- 20. **Sheep trimmings must be cleaned up and placed in manure pits.**
- 21. No trimming in the aisle.

1. Read Health Requirements and Livestock Rules carefully.
2. Entries must be on the American Dairy Goat Sanctioned Show Entry Form. Entry form must list the required goat tag/tattoo and official Scrapie ID number. Failure to submit complete entry will result in forfeiture of your premium check. Send form and fee to Glen Bauer, 6034 Kenyon Blvd, Faribault MN 55021.
3. All entries must be owned by the exhibitor, except in case of group entries.
4. There are no limits to the number of entries, **however, premiums are limited to two per class, per breed entered, except in group classes which will be one entry per exhibitor.**
5. The Junior and Senior Shows are separately sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern.
6. Classes are sanctioned for: LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, all other purebreds & recorded grades.
7. The original registration certificate is required for all does six months of age or older, and must be shown to the show secretary before the show begins. A stamped duplicate (valid only 30 days from date of official stamp) will be accepted for does under six months of age. No copies will be accepted.
8. Health papers are required for all animals from out of state, six months of age or older. Only healthy animals may be shown.
9. To qualify for premiums, goats must be in place and checked in by 10 p.m. on Monday. Released after the show but not before 8 p.m.
10. Veterinarian check by 8 a.m. on Tuesday.
11. The barn will open on Monday for penning. All goats must be in the barn by 10:00 p.m. on Monday. Pen space may be limited.
12. There will be no pre-show milk out.
13. All animals must be shown in a regular class to qualify for groups.
14. Show order: Seniors – each breed, Juniors – each breed.
15. Show order is subject to change to allow for a smoother running show.
