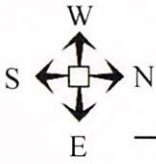

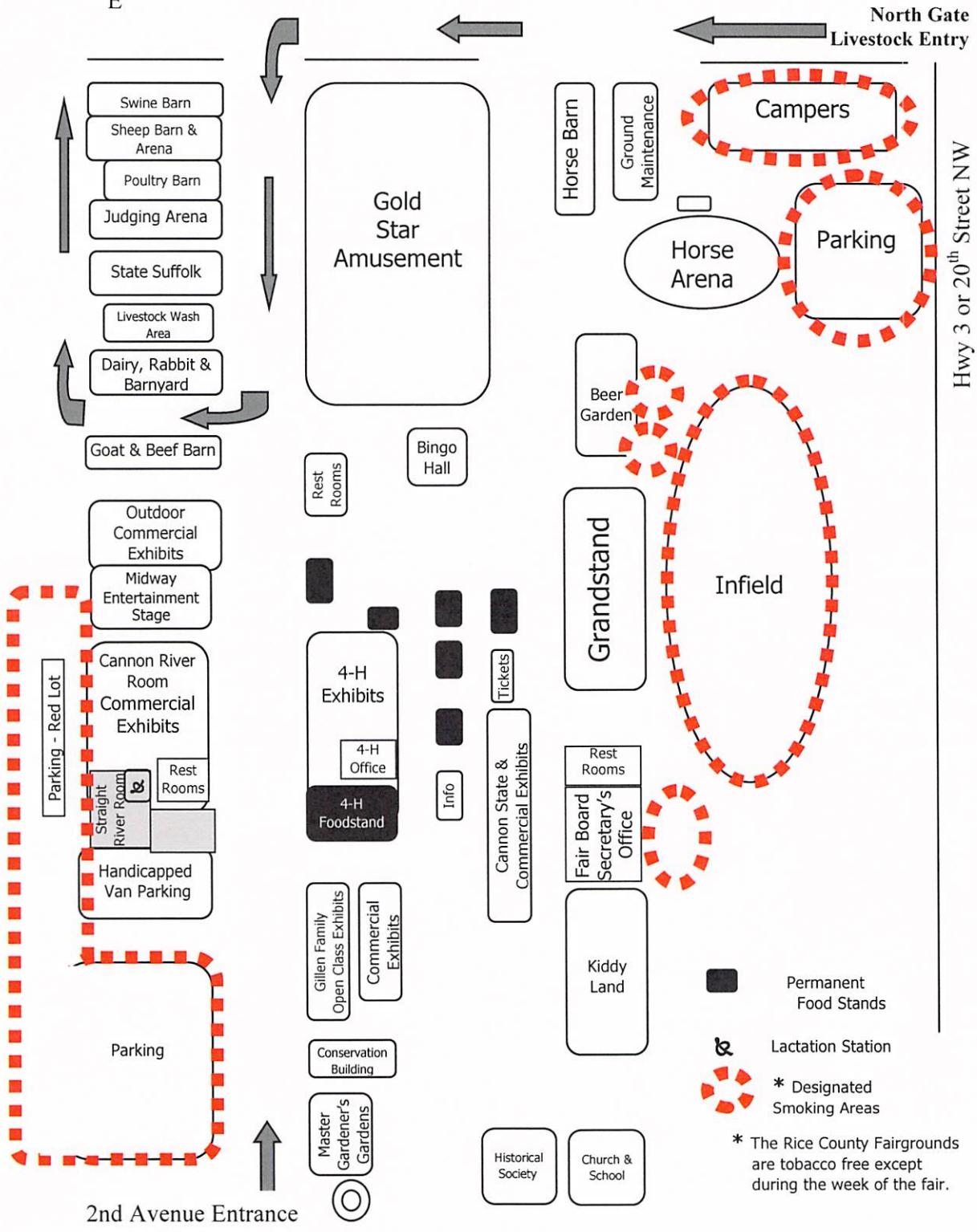

# GENERAL EXHIBIT RULES

1. Read Open Class and General Exhibit Rules carefully.
2. Exhibitors shall be from Rice and surrounding counties.
3. All exhibits must be owned/made by the exhibitor. Must have been completed within the past two years and can be exhibited only once at the Rice County Fair.
4. Articles exhibited as a collection cannot be exhibited separately.
5. No article will be assigned to a place until the entry is made.
6. Premiums will be awarded on articles that are considered worthy of prize by the judge.
7. The management reserves the right to pro-rate prizes in the event that it is necessary.
8. Individual exhibitors who are exhibiting more than one exhibit in a lot can receive only one premium.
9. Class lots listed under Primary, Elementary & Junior - exhibitor must be appropriate age by entry day. If a class lot is not listed under the age division, you may enter it under the Open Class General class lot.
10. Open Class Food exhibits will be judge on Monday. Exhibits in Classes 1 & 2 must be entered by 5 p.m. on Monday to be judged at 6:30 p.m.
11. Gillen Hall exhibitors will be judge on Tuesday starting at 8 a.m. (see rule #13 for Classes 1 & 2). Class 4 – Homemade Wine & Beer will be judged on Wednesday.
12. Entries must remain in place until 6:00 p.m. Sunday, July 21
13. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons may be given in each sub-heading under each class and one overall Grand Champion ribbon in each class. No extra premium will be paid. Adults, Juniors & Elementary are separate sub-headings.
14. Honorable Mention ribbons can be awarded at the discretion of the judge.
15. Complaints should be filed with the Department Superintendent.
16. Failure to abide by any rules or regulations will be reason to withhold premiums.
17. Premium checks will be available no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the fair.
18. No unauthorized gambling will be allowed on grounds.
19. **No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in buildings.**
20. Parking - each vehicle entering the fairgrounds must obtain one of the following permits:\$10 daily (per visit)

## CLASS REQUIREMENTS

Read General Exhibit Rules carefully!

### CLASS 1 – BAKING, CANDY MAKING

Exhibits must be entered by 5 p.m. in order to be judged at 6:30 p.m.

1. All entries shall be made from scratch.
2. Breads can be baked in small loaf or ½ large loaf.
3. No baked products to be returned unless so requested on the day of entry.

### CLASS 2 – HEALTHY EATING includes Gluten Free

Exhibits must be entered by 5 p.m. in order to be judged at 6:30 p.m.

1. All entries shall be made from scratch.
2. Recipe **MUST** be included.
3. No baked products to be returned to owner unless so requested on the day of entry.

### CLASS 3 – FOOD PRESERVATION

1. All exhibits must be in clear glass canning jars (1/2 pint, pints or quarts).
2. Items must have been preserved within the last 12 months.
3. Use preservation methods from the National Center for Food Preservation website.
4. All low acid products must be processed in pressure canner.
5. Fruits, tomatoes, pickles, jams and jellies must be processed by boiling water bath or pressure cooker.
6. Entries passing the appearance test may be opened and tested for final placing.
7. **REQUIRED** – Each exhibit must be labeled with the following information:

### CLASS 4 – HOMEMADE WINE, BEER

1. Contestants must be 21 years of age or order.

- WINE
2. May submit two entries per class, but may enter any number of classes.
  3. Entries must be homemade.
  4. Must be bottled in 26 oz. bottles, minimum size (clear bottles preferred).
  5. Bottles must be securely corked or capped.
  6. Bottle(s) must be labeled with description of contents.
  7. Bottle(s) will be assigned a number/class at time of entry.
- BEER
8. Submit one bottle of beer for each entry.
  9. Beers must be homebrewed by an amateur and in non-commercial facilities. Any entry brewed with the help of another brewer must be entered under the names of all brewers who helped.
  10. Beer may be made from malt, hops, grain, fruit/vegetable juice or any other product commonly used in making beer.
  11. Must be bottled in a clean brown or green bottle with at least a 10 oz. capacity. Prefer they have no raised-glass brand name lettering and printed caps are blacked out.
  12. Bottle must be labeled with description of contents and name of brewer.

### CLASS 5 - CRAFT, HOBBIES

1. All wall hangings/pictures must have PERMANENT HANGERS.
2. All exhibits must be made by exhibitor.
3. Lego/Duplos/similar material of multiple items must be on a sturdy base, size not to exceed 20" x 20".
4. No name labels on exhibit.

### CLASS 6 - RECYCLED

1. Item usage must be changed.

### CLASS 7 –METAL, WOOD

No specie class requirements.

## CLASS 8 – FINE ARTS

1. Exhibit must be an original painting by exhibitor, not copied from other artist or instructional art.
2. Framed pictures must have permanent hangers.
3. Unframed pictures must be mounted on Foam/poster board and/or matted.
4. Kits must be identified.
5. No Paint by Number. Enter in Class 5 – Crafts.

## CLASS 9 - PHOTOGRAPHY

1. Photos should be no more than 2 years old and have no obvious digital manipulation. See Digital Manipulation Category.
2. Photos may have a title, but a title is not required.
3. Due to space limitation, junior exhibitors may enter a maximum size of 8 x 10, adults 11 x 14.
4. No Frames-photo to be mounted on foam/poster board with or without mat. Allow no more than 2" around photo.
5. Any identifying logo on your print will be automatically disqualified.
6. Any print which does not fit the category that it is submitted will be disqualified.

**Digital Manipulation Category** – Original 4" x 6" photo(s) must be fastened to the back of your edited photo.

**Macro Photography Category** – The object should be photographed and printed larger than life size, and the center or most important part of the object very sharp and the rest of the photo out of focus. This takes a special lens and/or manual settings resulting in a very short depth of field. There are many internet sites with good information.

### What Is the Judge Looking For?

Impact, center of interest having good focus and light, difficulty, creativity, proper composition and cropping; detail in shadows and highlight areas.

## CLASS 10 - NEEDLEWORK

1. All wall hangings must have permanent hangers.

## CLASS 11–NURSING HOME, ASSISTED LIVING

1. Champion ribbon will go to top exhibit.

## CLASS 12 – PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

1. For persons with disabilities.
2. Champion ribbon will go to top exhibit.

## CLASS 13 - SEWING

No specie class requirements.

## CLASS 14 - FRUITS

1. Label container with variety.

## CLASS 15 - HERBS

1. Label container with variety.

## CLASS 16 - POTATOES

1. Ten (10) tubers.

## CLASS 17 – VEGETABLES, youth may enter adult category.

1. Label all vegetable exhibits with the variety.
2. Current year crop.
3. Check the website "[Garden Exhibit Requirements](#)".
4. Preparing vegetables for exhibit:  
**BEANS** – Wiped clean but not washed, stems attached  
**BEETS, CARROTS, PARSNIPS, TURNIPS, RUTABAGAS** – Tops trimmed off 1 1/4" above the crown, side roots trimmed off but not the top root, brush clean  
**BROCCOLI** – Cut about 5" from top of head  
**CABBAGE** – Stems cut about 1/2" below the head, remove blemished or broken leaves, leave few wrapper leaves

**CAULIFLOWER** – Cut to leave 4 to 6 leaves, outer leaves trimmed to 1-2" about the white head

**CELERY** – Remove roots, trim butt to form a triangle

**CUCUMBERS** – Leave stems attached, brush clean

**EGG PLANT** – Stem left on

**KOHLRABI** – Roots removed just below the ball, remove all but the center 4-6 leaves, wipe or brush clean but not washed

**ONIONS** – Do not peel, leave small root but trim to 1/2", tops 1 to 1-1/2", wipe or brush clean but not wash

**PEAS** – Do not was as bloom should be preserved

**PEPPERS** – Stem 1/2 - 1"

**RADISHES** – Root to 1/2", tops cut to 1/2"

**RHUBARB** – Stalks should be pulled not cut, blade leaf 2" above stalk

**SUMMER SQUASH** – Stem 1/2", wipe clean

**SWEET CORN** – Allow a short shank and the inner husk to remain

**TOMATOES** – Stem 1/2"

**WATERMELONS** – Stem 1"

## CLASS 18 – UNUSUAL FRUIT, VEGETABLE, POTATO

1. Exhibit will be judged by size and/or weight.
2. Current year crop.

## CLASS 19 - CORN, GRAIN, HAY

Label quart glass jar with variety or kind of plant.

1. All exhibits should be from the past year, except the grain sheaf.
2. Exhibits should be in quart glass jar.

## CLASS 20 – CUT FLOWERS

Label container with variety or kind of plant.

1. Flowers must be owned and grown by the exhibitor.
2. Containers are not judged, only the flowers.
3. No foliage below water line.
4. If a flower is listed in any lot, it cannot be entered in "Others not listed".

## CLASS 22 – LILY

1. Flowers must be owned and grown by exhibitor.
2. Containers are not judged.
3. A single spike grown by amateur gardeners only.

## CLASS 23 - ARRANGEMENTS

1. May only be exhibited once at the Rice County Fair.
2. Grown yourself and not purchased.

## CLASS 24 - PLANTS

Label container with variety or kind of plant.

1. Potted plants must be owned and grown by the exhibitor for three months prior to the fair.
2. Potted plants can be exhibited only once at the Rice County Fair.
3. Hanging plants must have a sturdy hanger.
4. Containers are not judged, only the plant.

## Public Notice to All Concerned

- While the greatest care will be executed by the Management to protect patrons of the Rice County Fair, each individual will be held responsible for his/her actions, and the Management will not be accountable or responsible for any injury.
- The Rice County Agricultural Society Management assumes no liability for loss or damage to any property of the concessionaire, exhibitors or patrons due to theft, fire, tornado, weather conditions or other causes.
- The Directors of the Rice County Fair Board reserve the right to refuse any offensive or obscene exhibits which in the judgment of the Fair Board would be offensive to the general public.
- No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the grounds or in any building, except in the Beer Garden.
- Any person or group that conducts a protest action must limit its activity to the location designated by the Fair Board. The designated location is the North West corner of the fairgrounds, by Hwy 3 and Fairgrounds Drive. The space is 50' x 50' on fairgrounds property. No entrance or exits can be obstructed or limited in any way.

## LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Read Livestock Rules and Health Requirements carefully.
2. Use appropriate entry form to enter livestock. Entries must be made in advance to the superintendents of the respective departments by deadline.
3. **Entry form must list the animal required ear tag/tattoo and official Scrapie ID number. Failure to submit completed entry and payment will result in forfeiture of your premium check.**
4. Open to residents of Minnesota and out-of-state as space permits.
5. All entries must be owned by the exhibitor.
6. No entry will be assigned a space until the entry check-in is complete.
7. Complaints should be filed with the Livestock Committee.
8. All animals entered must be shown in the ring to receive premium.
9. Failure to abide by any rules or regulations will be reason to withhold premiums.
10. In case there is no competition in any class, the prize money awarded will be left to the discretion of the judge.
11. Any person in Rice County, and others as indicated, can exhibit in this department. Open Class Livestock includes: beef, horse, goat and sheep.
12. Premium checks will be available no later than two weeks after the conclusion of the fair.
13. Premiums will be awarded only on articles that are considered worthy of prize by the judge.
14. No more than two premiums per individual lot, or one premium in group lot, will be awarded to one exhibitor.
15. Management reserves the right to pro-rate prizes if necessary.
16. No unauthorized gambling will be allowed on grounds.
17. **No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in barns.**
18. Parking - each vehicle entering the fairgrounds must obtain and display one of the following : **daily \$10 (per visit)**
19. **Animal registration papers or proof of being eligible for registration must be presented at the time of fair entry. If no registration papers are presented your entry will be eligible for grade only classes.**
20. FFA and Rice County 4-H members are eligible to show in open class competition if registration form is submitted and entry fee is paid by the entry deadline.
21. **All animals must have adequate bedding and water. NO bedding/feed will be provided by the Fairboard. No muzzles allowed.**
22. All fans must meet electrical inspection. Fan position and safety can be regulated by the Livestock Committee and/or Fair Vet. No Butt Fans.
23. Wheel barrels for waste should be emptied frequently. Do not over fill. Do not leave in the aisles. Clean-up your spills. Keep the walkways **inside** and **outside** clean.
24. **Absolutely** no livestock on the North side of the barns.
25. Trailers, campers, trucks or other vehicles used for living purposes during the fair must be parked in designated camping areas only. Owner of the vehicle must secure a camping pass from the Fair Secretary's office prior to parking the vehicle.

26. No political signs.

**The management will not be responsible for loss of any exhibit or for any damage done to same, but will endeavor to take proper care of all exhibits.**

## MN LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION RULES

### General Requirements:

Animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibition. All out-of-state animals must meet MN importation requirements. No animal may enter or be at an exhibition that is showing clinical signs of any infectious, contagious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts.

### Horses

Horses, except suckling foals accompanying a negative dam, must be negative to an official equine infectious anemia (Coggins) test conducted within 12 months prior to the opening date of an exhibition.

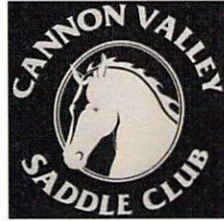
